The K2 Preview

We the People of the United States will now turn our attention to some of the most influential leaders of our free country. We will begin the week by exploring George Washington's experiences during the Revolutionary War and his following presidency. Along the way, we will study how he shaped the role of the president and what his teeth were made of. We will end the week by visiting the life of Thomas Jefferson, our 3rd president. We will explore how this inventor used his knowledge to write The Declaration of Independence.

Language Arts: sight words: just, had, give, any; word family: -ike (like, hike, etc); persuasive posters, blending words, segmentation, review language conventions to date

Math: write numerals to 90, write and solve simple word problems, count dimes, nickels, and pennies, halves and fourths, add ten to a number, sequence numbers least to greatest, ordinal directions, tally marks, graphs, number patterns

Social Studies: the life of George Washington including his presidency and legends, Thomas Jefferson's life, presidency, and influence as an inventor

Practice at Home

For language, your child will find the rhyming word from the picture and write another word that rhymes with the pair. A second sheet is attached in which they will match the sentence to the picture and draw a picture of the given word.

In math, your child will use the given blocks to measure the toys. The last activity requires your child to count the coins in each group and find the total amount of money.

In addition to these pages, please have your child read his/her individual baggie book each night. Also, make a set of sight words for your child and review them nightly. Our sight words this week are : just, had, give, any, and -ike words (like, hike, etc.).
