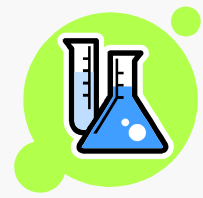

The K2 Preview

This week, we will be exploring the life of influential leaders and scientists. We will begin with our current president, Barack Obama. We will explore his family, his dog Bo, and his importance as the first African American president. We will then focus on the impact of George Washington Carver, Jane Goodall, and the Wright Brothers. How did George Washington Carver affect today's agriculture? What did Jane Goodall observe in chimpanzees? How is modern-day travel contributed to the Wright Brothers? All of these questions will be answered this week!

Language Arts: sight words: ask, think, live, fly; word family: -eat (heat, meat, etc); compare and contrast, persuasive writing, review describing words

Math: write numerals to 100, simple word problems, congruent shapes, measuring line segments, groups of ten, counting coins, number patterns, halves and fourths, even and odd numbers, comparing quantities

Social Studies: Barack Obama—life, presidency, family; George Washington Carver—life, agriculture, peanuts; Jane Goodall—life, chimpanzees, emotions; Wright Brothers—life, flight

Practice at Home

All homework is due on Friday.

For language, your child will find the short vowel sound that is needed to complete the word. For the second activity, your child will identify the beginning sound in each word to write the name of the animal.

In math, your child will identify the time on the analogue clock. The second activity requires your child to circle the groups of tens to create a two-digit number.

I have also included a student book, "The Wright Brothers' First Flight". Please read this each night and allow students to color if they wish.

In addition to these pages, please have your child read his/her individual baggie book each night. Also, make a set of sight words for your child and review them nightly. Our sight words this week are : ask, think, live, fly, and -eat words (heat, meat, etc.).
