The K2 Preview

This week is the start to an extended study of the continents. We will begin with our home, North America. To begin the week, we will discuss landscapes and create a relief map of North America. Then we will learn about native animals by studying their size, diet, and physical features. We will also explore major crops of North America. We will conclude the unit by exploring cultures of other North American countries.

Language Arts: ; site words: we, look, run, brown; word family: -ug (bug, rug, etc); punctuation; order of words in spoken sentence

Math: write numerals to 25; reading a graph; ordinal directions, simple word problems, simple addition, geometric shapes, telling time

Social Studies: countries within North America, landscapes of North America, animals native to North America, and major crops of North America

For language, your child will complete two sheets on North American countries. They must practice writing the name of each country. For Canada, they will find the Canadian goose that is different and for Mexico, they will color the sombrero. Please ensure that your child uses proper letter formation. A second sheet is attached in which your child will sound out each word to find the word that matches the picture. Then, they will rewrite the word on the handwriting lines.

In math, your child will count the number of objects in the picture and write the numeral to match three times. The second math sheet requires your child to read the analogue clock and write the time on the line.

In addition to these pages, please have your child read his/her individual baggie book each night. Also, make a set of site words for your child and review them nightly. Our site words this week are : we, look, run, brown, and -ug words (bug, rug).
